Scope: Catalonia

Univers: Spanish citizens of 18 years of age and more who live in Catalonia

Method of data collection:

Computer Assisted Telephone Interview (CATI)

Sampling procedure:

Stratified by size of the municipality with selection of last sample units (individuals) using sex, age and place of birth crossed quotas and an additional quota for the whole sample by household type (landline/cellular phone).

Town size is divided into 6 categories: less or equal to 2,000 inhabitants; from 2,001 and 10,000 inhabitants; from 10,001 and 50,000 inhabitants; from 50,001 and 150,000 inhabitants; from 150,001 and 1,000,000 inhabitants; more than 1 million inhabitants.

To calculate the quotas we use the official statistics from the *Padró continu de població* from the year 2019. The age quotas correspond to the following intervals: 18 to 24 years of age; 25 to 34 years of age; 35 to 49 years of age; 50 to 64 years of age ; 65 and more years of age.

Sample size:

1,500 interviews with the following distribution by province:

• Barcelona	1,160
• Girona	106
• Lleida	82
• Tarragona	152

Allocation:

Proportional.

Sampling error:

The overall margin of error of the survey is ± 2.53 , for a confidence level of 95% (1.96 sigma) and under the assumption of maximum indetermination ($p=q=50\%$). In each province the margins of error are:

• Barcelona	± 2.88
• Girona	± 9.52
• Lleida	± 10.82
• Tarragona	± 7.95

Fieldwork:

The fieldwork has been performed by GESOP. Gabinet d'Estudis Socials i Opinió Pública. SL from the 25th of November to the 7th of December 2020.

Methodological note:

1. Given that we have only drawn a sample from the population (those over 17 years of age, living in Catalonia and with Spanish citizenship), all results are subject to a sampling error, meaning that not all the differences in the same questions with respect to other waves of the survey are statistically significant.

For instance, in a survey question where the 50 % (the worst-case scenario in terms of the margin of error) gives a particular response, the “true” value in the population would fall into the range of ± 2.53 of the results in the sample. This is, if we were to repeat many time the same survey with the same characteristics, we would guess the “true” value 95% of the times if we said it was in between 47.5% and 52.5%.

The subsamples coming from the cross-tabulations between different variables are subject to a wider margin of error. As a result, the conclusions that could be derived from such cross-tabulations with very small subsamples have to be treated with caution.

Methodological note:

1. In the graphics with time series data, the BOP of March 2014 has been established as the starting point as it coincides with the change of methodology in the data collection. 2. The October 2020 telephone data refers to the Sociopolitical Survey, which was a telephone survey.

3. When presenting results of questions 26b we have grouped the different political parties or coalitions from the point of view of parliamentary groups appeared after the 21st of December elections to the Catalan Parliament 2017. The results of this grouping are:

Junts per Catalunya = CDC + PDeCAT + Junts per Catalunya

Catalunya en Comú-Podem = ICV-EUiA + Podemos + Barcelona en comú + Catalunya sí que es pot + En Comú Podem + Catalunya en Comú

4. In the case of questions 12 (party sympathy), 23 (intention to vote in the Parliament of Catalonia) and 25 (party that believes it will win the elections to the Parliament of Catalonia), the following grouping of parties was carried out:

Catalunya en Comú Podem = ICV-EUiA + Podemos + Barcelona en Comú + Catalunya sí que es pot + En Comú Podem + Catalunya en Comú.

5. With regard to question 23 (intention to vote in Parliament), the mentions to CDC have been incorporated into the PDeCAT category.

6. It has been established that those parties or coalitions that are scheduled to run in the next elections to the Parliament of Catalonia on February 14, 2021 and that have obtained more than 1% in some questions 12, 23, 25 and 26b are represented in questions 12, 23, 25 and 26b. This is the case of Vox and PDeCAT.

7. When the real base of the cross-tabulations is lower than 20 cases it is considered non-significant it is indicated with “*”.



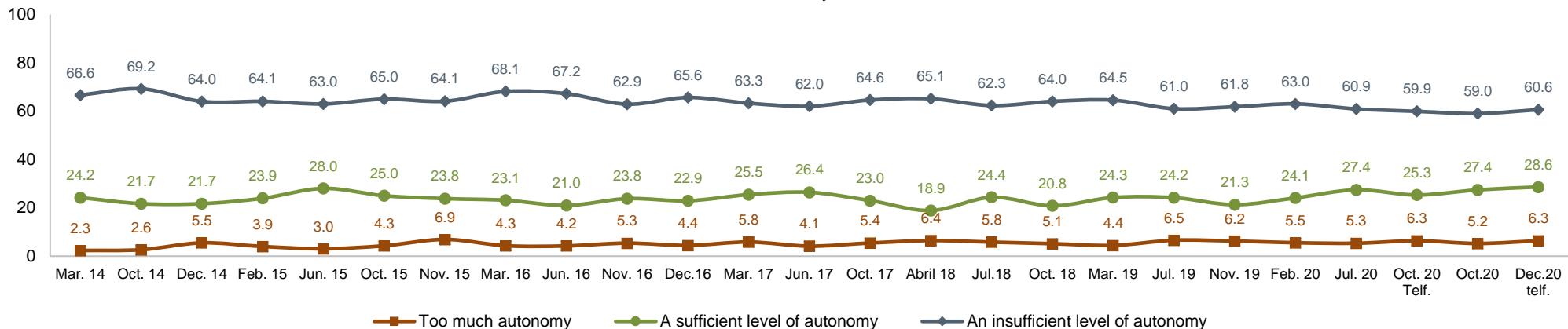
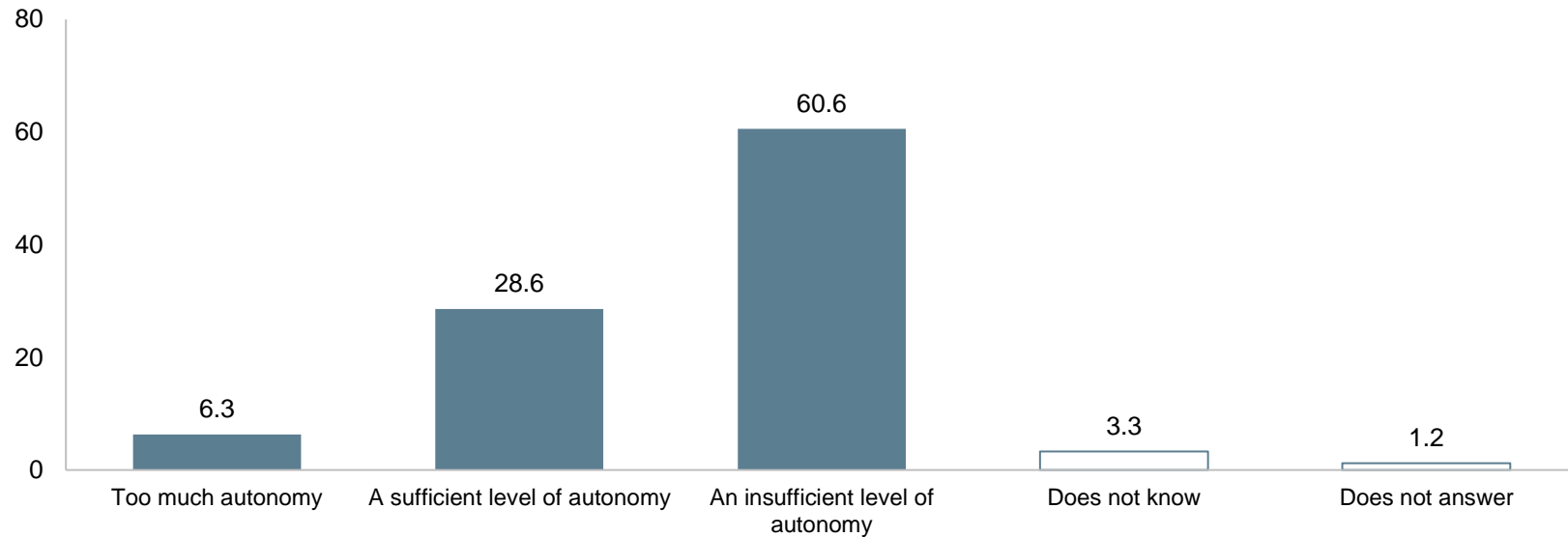

Do you think that Catalonia has achieved...

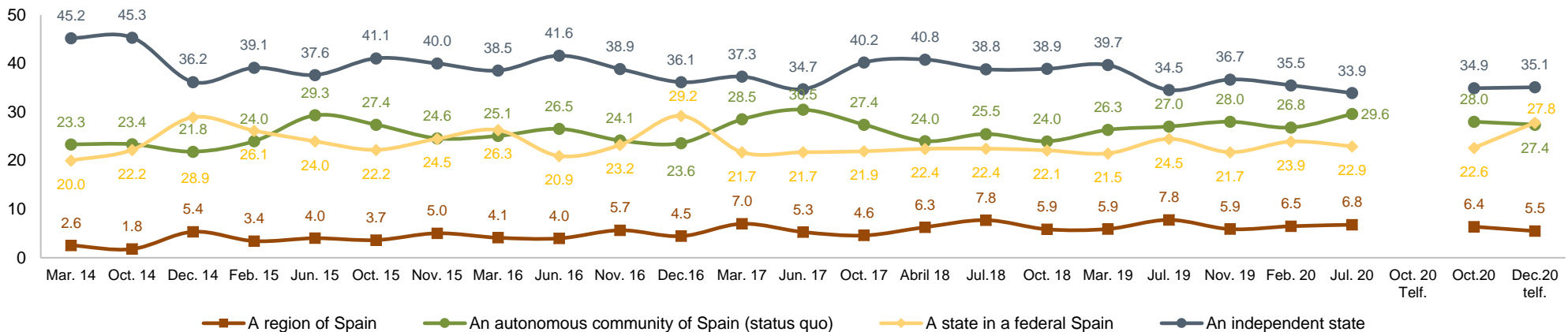
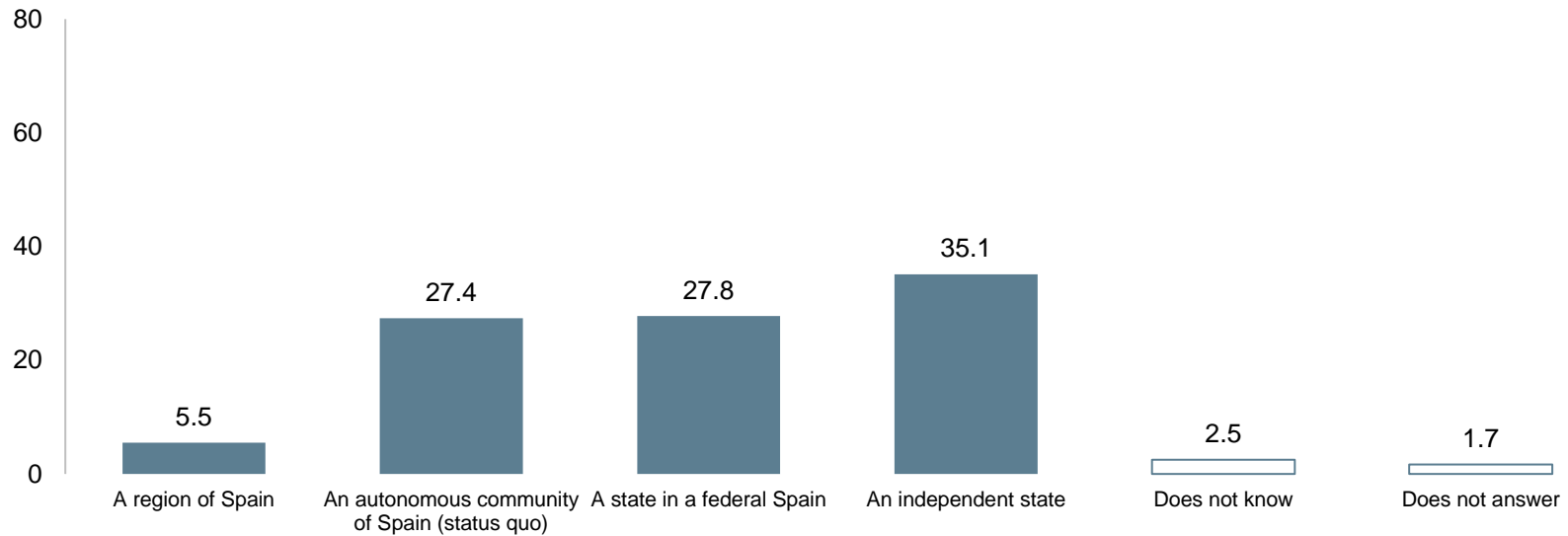

Catalonia-Spain relationship by vote intention to the Catalan Parliament



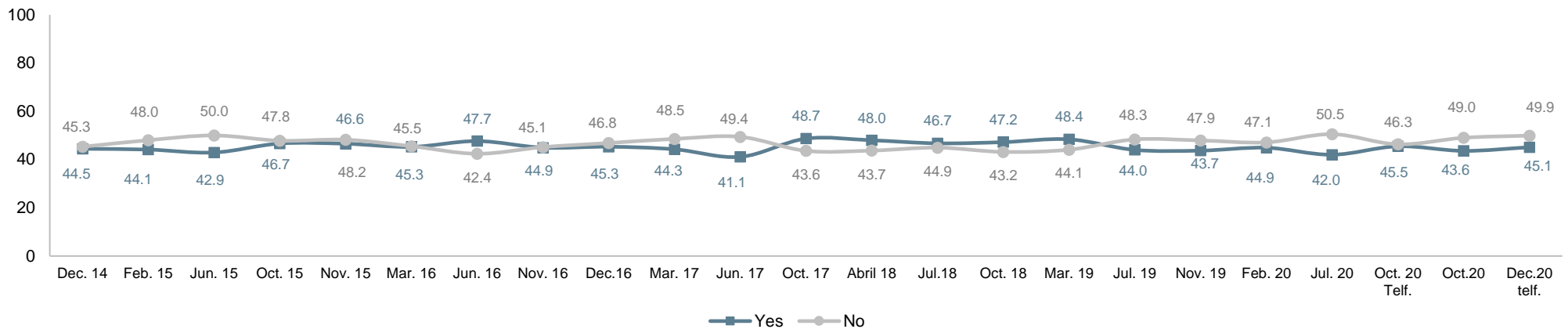
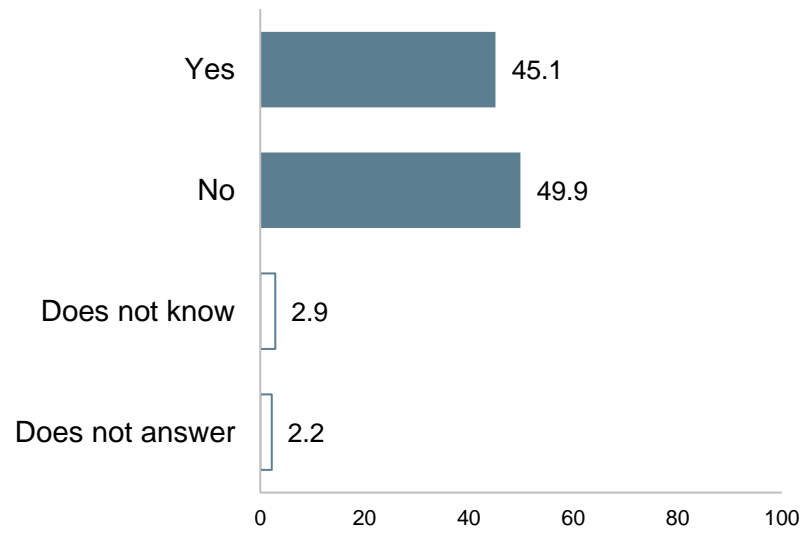

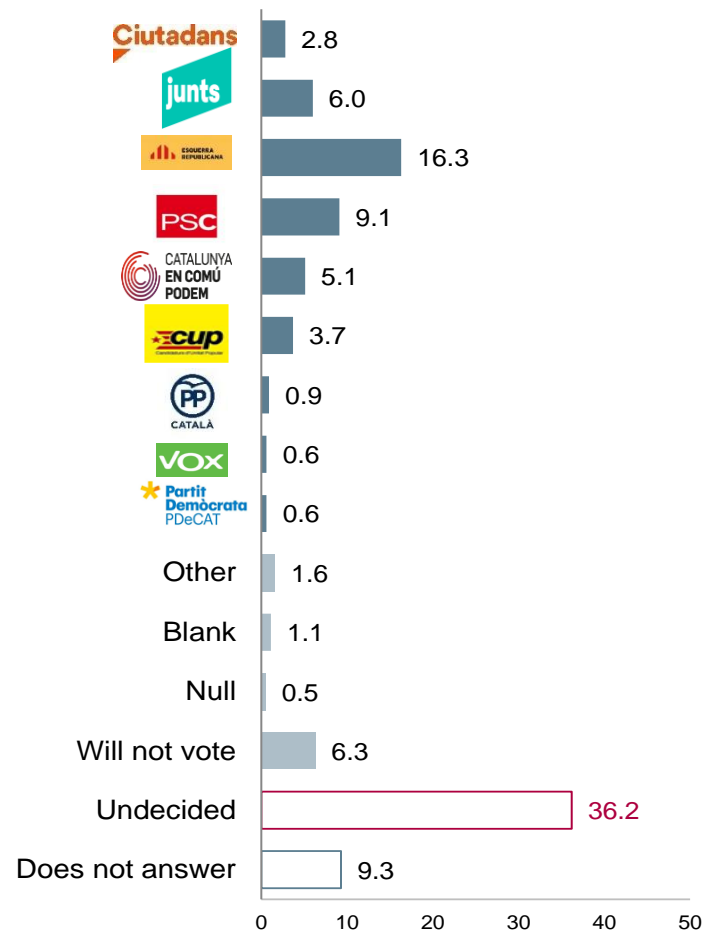

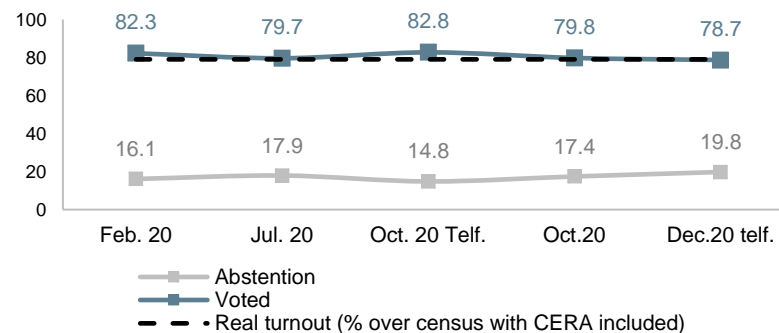
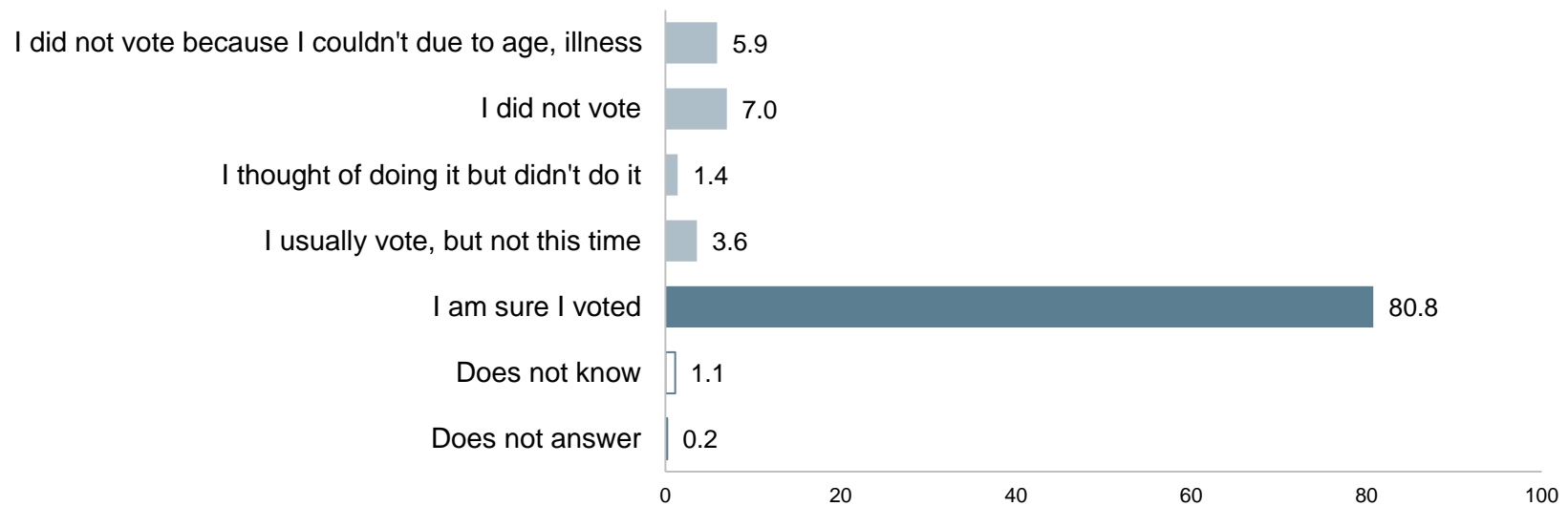


Elections to the Catalan Parliament: vote recall

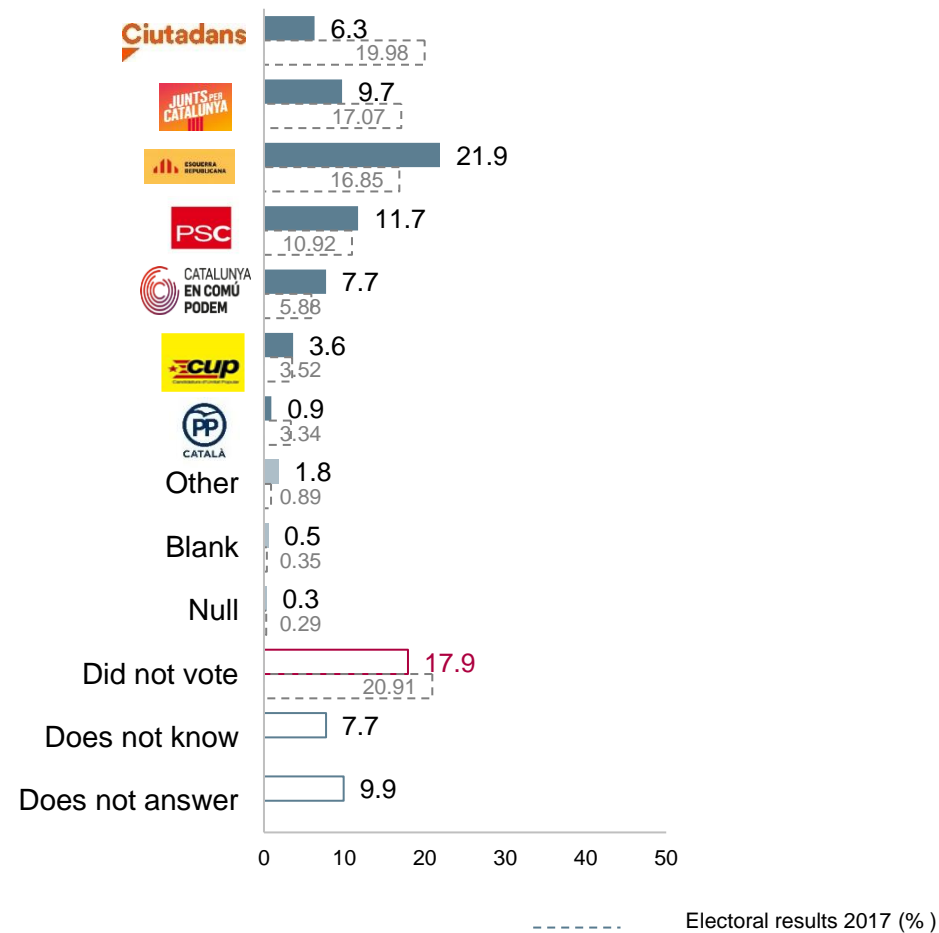
